

Six Mile Creek Trail: Southtown Centre to Lemar Drive (Phase I)

Project Description

The Six Mile Creek Trail will be a 10' wide asphalt multi-use trail. It will connect to the existing Rivergreenway Trail System at Southtown Centre and at Moser Park and will provide the final link of a 26 mile loop. Phase I of the Six Mile Creek Trail will be one mile in length and will be designed and constructed first. This phase will run north along the west side of Anthony Boulevard from South Phoenix Parkway, across US 27/33 to the intersection of Tillman Road. From here the trail will travel east along the south side of Tillman Road to the intersection of Tillman and Lemar Drive. Parking and node amenities will be offered in this area.

The preliminary engineering phase of this project began in 2010. The right of way phase is scheduled to begin in 2011. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2013. This project is being funded through the Transportation Enhancement (TE) fund.

The following is the cost breakdown for the Six Mile Creek Trail project as shown in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).
